Dear CCSD Board Members,

I'm sending this letter to inform you of the findings from our recent survey performed by EMC research and Board action taken in regards to a November tax measure for the North County Recreation and Park District.

I have attached a copy of a summary of the key findings of the survey and the survey results. Unfortunately the results are not in favor of us getting a tax measure passed this November. After careful review of the survey findings, the North County Recreation and Park District Board voted to not place a tax measure on the November ballot.

Other factors that led to our board's decision: the NMC Unified School District placed a measure on the ballot in June that failed. The North County Fire District received similar results for a fire tax measure from a recent survey they did, with a different consultant - SCI. Our survey results showed that all of those things were high on the priority list; traffic and road repairs, education, reducing fire risk and maintaining quality parks and recreational services. The respondents just do not want to pay taxes to support them.

We will continue to expand our community outreach and education in hopes that there will be a time in future that the community will support a tax measure for our district.

**DATE:** July 6, 2018

The following are key findings from a recent opinion survey of voters in the North County Recreation and Park District. Voters were invited to participate via a mailed print survey and those with emails available were invited to take the survey online. The survey was conducted from May 21-June 22, 2018 with 224 valid surveys returned from likely November 2018 voters in the North County Recreation and Park District. The survey was offered in English and Spanish.

#### **Key Findings**

Most respondents (53%) are satisfied with the overall quality of local parks and nearly half of respondents (46%) report using local parks and recreational facilities at least a few times per year. Those with children are more likely to be park users (72%).

Park facilities and recreational programs are important to respondents. Accessibility, bathroom maintenance, safety, affordability, and improvements to youth programs are top priorities for local parks and recreation.

Despite recognition from local voters of the need for funding for local parks and recreation, a parcel tax does not appear feasible at this time. Nearly three-quarters of respondents (73%) recognize a need for additional funding for neighborhood parks and recreation programs; however, just 47% would support a parcel tax today, short of the necessary two-thirds threshold required to pass.

Even though parks and recreation programs are important to the community, other local issues take precedence, and tax aversion is an issue. A wide majority (71%) express maintaining high-quality parks and recreational services as a priority for the community. However, other local issues are even more important, such as reducing traffic and repairing local streets and roads (88% priority) and improving public education (80% priority). There is also significant resistance to new taxes, with 48% of respondents saying they generally oppose increases to property taxes regardless of what they are used for.

#### Methodology



- Survey of voters in the North County Recreation and Park District
- were invited to take the survey online via an emailed invitation Voters were invited to participate via a mailed, printed survey; voters with emails available
- 224 usable surveys were returned; 136 completed by mail and 88 by web
- 3,452 surveys were mailed with response rate of 3.9%
- 2,372 voters were invited by email with a response rate of 3.7%
- Survey conducted May 21-June 22, 2018
- Survey offered in both English and Spanish



More respondents express pessimism than optimism about how things are going in the County.





Nearly half of respondents report using North County parks, facilities and programs at least a few times a year.







Most respondents do see at least some need for additional funding for parks and recreation programs.



While a majority are satisfied with the overall quality of parks, many indicate a need for improvements to recreational facilities.



#### nitial Vote



Support for a potential parcel tax measure for parks, recreational programs and facilities is well short of the two-thirds needed for passage.


To provide clean, safe parks for local residents; enhance recreational programs and facilities for children, youth, adults, and seniors; ensure park facilities are accessible to persons with disabilities; maintain park bathrooms; and, attract and retain experienced staff to operate facilities and supervise recreation programs, shall the North County Recreation and Park District annually levy \$80 per parcel on each parcel within the District, raising approximately \$300,000 per year, unless ended by voters, with all funds for local parks and recreation?



## Measure Initial Support, by Subgroup




Support is higher among those who use the parks, but still short of two-thirds.



## Measure Initial Support, by Subgroup




Younger respondents are more supportive of a measure than older respondents.



### Reasons for Voting Yes




Respondents provide a range of reasons for supporting the measure, including that there is a need and citing the benefits to kids and the community.



## Reasons for Voting No or Undecided




Resistance to taxes and government are the most common reasons for opposing the measure.

Accessibility, bathroom maintenance, safety, and affordability are top priorities for local parks and recreation. Youth programs are also very important.



All messages explaining the benefits of a measure are convincing to a majority, but none of them are convincing to two-thirds



This measure is a good investment. Maintaining quality parks, open space, and recreational programs will protect our local property values and make sure our community is a desirable place to live, work, and raise a family.



Most tax measures have an expiration date, but this measure has no end date; that means we'll continue getting taxed even if the funding is no longer needed.
